

Kim Leclair, of course, has always been an Arts Council participant and promoter.

Thanks to Barb Sayles, Mischelle Pierce, Silke Fligge, Angelina Brooymans, Marilyn Kelly, and Amanda Pryzner Dunn for directly managing Gallery shows and processes when I've been absent.

And thanks to Angelina Brooymans, Kerstin Auer, Mischelle of course and the others who have jumped in to take over some of my favorite initiatives, projects, and committee work.

I brought to my curator position and participation on the arts committees and projects *my experience*, *expertise*, *and skill sets* gleaned from my personal upbringing, the years working with my family gift and book shop, experiences raising my own family, and over 30 years as an educator, most with the First Nations community (I put up a lot of displays in the gym and hallways. And put on endless events!). All those experiences made the *taking on the position of Art Gallery Director* a possibility, with the support, guidance, and encouragement from my family and arts council community. It has been a learning experience, a fulfilling, inspiring, and challenging experience, that I am grateful to have made a part of my life's journey.

Those early years with Mischelle Pierce, Jackie Stibbards, Chelsea Werrun, Jean Kiegerl, Jane Bartle, Denise Kearney, Leonard George, Kelly and Joel Reid, Amrit Ahuja, Jen Artibise... in the Courthouse were something else! Building on the past work of arts council artists like Bev Veale, Kim Leclair, and Shirley Reynolds we were able to initiate outstanding projects, like new arts programs, Open Mic and the Gift Shop.

These projects and the Gallery Shows continued and expanded with our move here to 2051 Voght Street. And with our competent, talented people, with a variety of skill sets, I enjoyed the new initiatives of the Arts Trailer, Spirit Square events, our stellar interns Kari Kroeker and Brooklyn Harris, and the amazing collaborative City Arts project. The NVCAC really has claimed an impactful, respected, creative space in our community.

In my involvement, I have to say I really enjoyed working with our musicians and visual artists. Open Mic was a favorite, and gave me hours of enjoyment and respite on Friday nights while my partner of 35 years was winding down. In my position as Gallery Curator I was impacted, often to tears, at the talent and personal expression of the artists I worked with. Every show but one was with our local talent. And one of the things I really appreciated was the support of my NVCAC friends and colleagues, to put on a variety of shows, reaching into the heart of our community with individuals and groups who were not always part of an arts exhibition. Like the taxidermists, fly tiers, shoe collectors, clothing and furniture upcyclers, tattoo and hair artists.

Definitely some of my favorites!

I was thankful to have the opportunity to bring people together around tough issues, like mental health, our Covid experience, the tragic floods in 2021? (with a show about our pets "Creature Comforts"), and "Art Heals", how art plays a part in our personal, community, and global healing journeys.

From tragedy to joy, expressing yourself is a good thing... IMHO

So, thanks all. On to the next chapter. Thank you for the encouragement I have received from you to take this next step. And good luck to the NVCAC and arts community. I can't imagine anything less than the continued success of the NVCAC, with the participation of the competent, inspiring and joyful team that makes the Arts Council what it is in the community.
